

Liposuction is a procedure which uses small cannulae (blunt needles) via multiple small incisions to remove fat without removing any skin. It therefore requires skin contraction which can take up to a year after surgery before the final result can be assessed. As we age our skin quality deteriorates and therefore the predictability of skin contraction reduces. Therefore it is always important that liposuction is performed judiciously and not overdone which could create other issues.

Further risks of liposuction include contour irregularities (that can sometimes be difficult to correct), lumpiness, infection, bleeding, bruising, skin death (which is rare) and, very rarely, damage to internal organs. Other indirect complications that have been associated with liposuction (particularly high volume liposuction) include blood loss requiring a blood transfusion, blood clots and fluid collections requiring drainage.
